Wells Lecture on Freedom for the Wrongfully Convicted. Additionally, create spaces to process content via post-event conversations.	Host monthly conversations, open to the LifePath community, on applying the White Ally Toolkit to daily life (Dec 2023-May 2024).	Local expression opportunity around racial justice: Inclusionary zoning law changes to increase the availability of affordable housing in the community.  Conduct a Life Seminar on Restorative Practices.

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<b>Q2 2024</b> (Apr-June)	Invite the LifePath community to join a Juneteenth Celebration, for example the Juneteenth Celebration at the Cooch's Bridge Historic Site.	Host monthly conversations, open to the LifePath community, on applying the White Ally Toolkit to daily life (Dec 2023-May 2024).  Invite the LifePath community to a reflection and debrief conversation around the "Bigger Gospel" message series in June.	Local expression opportunity around racial justice: Voting in the April City Council elections in Newark.
<b>Q3 2024</b> (July-Sept)	Invite the LifePath community on a group trip focused on racial justice, such as to the Jane and Littleton Mitchell Center for African American Heritage in Wilmington and/or to 24-7 Prayer USA's JUST Weekend '24 event in Washington, DC.  Host and encourage participation in a multi-week book study on racial justice and the Church.		SundayServe partner with a local church (e.g., St. John AME, Chippey AUM Church, Calvary Baptist) in an area of shared conviction.
<b>Q4 2024</b> (Oct-Dec)	Support a 2 <sup>nd</sup> White Ally Toolkit workshop sponsored by the YWCA (tentative date October 13, 2024).  Support the Newark Branch NAACP Freedom Fund Banquet fundraiser (October 20, 2024).  Host or partner on an end- of-year Watch Night Service to encourage reflection, lament, and calls to action on race.		Local expression opportunity around racial justice: Voting in local, state, and national elections.
